Aotearoa/New Zealand in the 21st century is ‘diverse’. Sexuality, ethnicity, indigeneity, age, health, occupation, income, religion & disability all define the different experiences of women. How does this diversity shape ‘women’ & ‘womanhood’ in Aotearoa today? Do our differences divide us? How might we build stronger connections among women, while respecting & celebrating our diversity?

Connecting Women: Respecting Differences explores this theme of difference & considers strategies for connecting diverse women. We encourage proposals that engage with the often difficult dialogues that are encompassed within the conference theme of difference, diversity, & intersectionality. We also extend a general invitation for papers, workshops, panel discussions, performances & artistic displays addressing other themes relevant to the work of the association — gender & work, pay equity, women's health, media representations, the body, violence against women, Maaori, Pasifika & indigenous women’s issues, migrant & refugee women’s issues, women & policy, women’s art, women’s resistance, & more. In light of the deepening impacts of climate change, we welcome proposals that reflect feminist engagement with environmental issues & activism. We also encourage proposals from community-based women’s groups & postgraduate students.
