The 2018 *Women's Studies Journal* Best Graduate Essay Prize

Call for entries

Entries are open for the 2018 *Women's Studies Journal* Graduate Prize for a Feminist Essay, awarded by the Women's Studies Association, and administered by the editorial collective of the *Women's Studies Journal*. The award will be presented to the author/s of a submitted essay that is considered by the judging panel to be the best representation of contemporary feminist scholarship. For the 2018 prize the theme is **Studying Feminism in Dangerous Times**. We are open to a range of interpretations of this topic, and welcome submissions from all feminist graduate students.

Entries close on **1st August 2018**, and the winning essay will be announced on 1st October 2018. The award consists of a **\$500 cash prize**, and consideration for publication in the *Women's Studies Journal*.

Eligibility

To be eligible to enter, you must be enrolled in a graduate degree at a tertiary institution in Aotearoa New Zealand at the time of writing the essay.

Entries

The essay should be an original piece of work that has not been published or accepted for publication elsewhere. The essay should be in the range of 4-5,000 words, and can be research-based, reflective, or creative in its approach. Joint authorship is permitted, subject to both authors meeting the eligibility criteria.
